1.	Makeup & Personal Care items	Naked Pantry, New Milton	Separated by polymer type then extruded into plastic pellets to make new recycled products.	Oakhaven Hospice
2.	Crisp Packets & peanut etc	Priestlands School	Made into plastic pellets to make recycled products.	Priestlands School Eco Projects
3.	Biscuit, Cracker and Cake Wrappers	Priestlands School	Made into plastic pellets to make recycled products.	Priestlands School Eco Projects
4.	Aluminium & Foil	Pennington	Taken to scrap metal merchant in Ferndown for a small payment	Pennington Community Allotment
5.	Printer cartridges	Brockenhurst Primary School	Undamaged cartridges re-used. Damaged broken down and separated into raw materials for re-use	Brockenhurst Primary school
6.	Bras	Beyond the skin handbags.	Sent to countries such as Togo, Ghana and Kenya, where bras remain too expensive to produce locally.	Against Breast Cancer research
7.	Small Flower pots	Swallowmead nursery, Boldre	Sent to Eco Gen (Winchester) who send on for reprocessing into pellets for making new items	
8.	Plastic bags	Waitrose Lymington	Chipped into pellets which can then be reprocessed into new bags or used to make recycled products like park benches.	
9.	Milk bottle tops	Memcap New Milton	Melted pellets and sold back into UK industry for recycled products	Memcap / Gateway Club Brock
10.	Writing implements	Springhill Catholic Primary School	separated by material & melted into hard plastic that can be remolded into recycled products	Springhill School
11.	Oral care products	Oak lodge Dental practice, Brock	separated by polymer type, cleaned, and extruded into plastic pellets to make new recycled products	British Heart Foundation
12.	CDs & DVDs	Oxfam, Lymington	Sold in Southampton Oxfam Music shop or online	Oxfam
13.	Used Stamps	RNIB	Sold to philatelists	RNIB
